

The Argyll and Bute Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by paragraph 1(1) of Schedule 2 to the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994(a) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and after carrying out such consultation as he considers appropriate, hereby makes the following Direction:

Citation and commencement

1. This Direction may be cited as the Argyll and Bute Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994 and shall come into force on 11th November 1994.

Interpretation

2. In this Direction—

“electoral division” means a division of Strathclyde Region as constituted by the Strathclyde Region (Electoral Arrangements) Order 1993(b);

“Argyll and Bute Report” means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Argyll and Bute District dated 18th August 1994(c);

"Dumbarton Report" means the Report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Dumbarton District dated 13th September 1994.

Specification of Wards

3. For the purpose of any election of councillors held before the relevant year of election, the Argyll and Bute local government area shall be divided into 33 electoral wards being—

- (a) the twenty seven proposed wards described (subject to the amendments set out in the Schedule to this Direction) in the Argyll and Bute Report;
- (b) the three proposed wards numbered district ward 6 (Helensburgh East), district ward 7 (Helensburgh Central) and district ward 8 (Helensburgh West) described in the Dumbarton Report with those electoral wards being numbered wards 28, 29 and 30 respectively in place of the numbering of those proposed wards in the Dumbarton Report;
- (c) the following electoral ward—

Electoral Ward 31: Rhu/Garelochhead/Luss

The area comprising—

- (i) the area covered by proposed ward numbered district ward 9 (Rhu/Garelochhead) described in the Dumbarton Report; and
 - (ii) that part of electoral division 8 (Vale of Leven) which falls within the Argyll and Bute local government area; and
- (d) the two proposed wards numbered district ward 10 (Arrochar/Kilcreggan) and district ward 11 (Cardross/Craigendoran) described in the Dumbarton Report

with those electoral wards being numbered wards 32 and 33 respectively in place of the numbering of those proposed wards in the Dumbarton Report.

SCHEDULE

Paragraph 3(a)

For the purposes of this Direction, the description of wards referred to in the Argyll and Bute Report is amended as follows:—

- (a) in district ward 7 (Lochgilphead), for the word “northward” substitute the word “southward”;
- (b) in district ward 11 (Islay (Kilarrow, Jura and Colonsay)), after the word “southwestward”, insert the words “to Dubh Artach then southeastward”; and
- (c) in district ward 25 (Milton), for the reference “1642 7684” substitute the reference “1641 7684”.
