

**Second Review of Scottish Parliament Boundaries
Further Proposals for Constituencies and Provisional Proposals for Regions
Consultation
Request for Local Inquiry**

For decision

1. The consultation on Further Proposals for constituencies and Provisional Proposals for regions closes on 26 October 2024. Commissioners will be provided with all the responses and accompanying analysis at the 4 November 2024 meeting. Prior to this it would assist the Secretariat if Commissioners could consider this paper and provide formal approval for a local inquiry to be held in Renfrewshire.

Background

2. The Scotland Act 1998 out sets out the rules for when a local inquiry must be held – see Appendix A.
3. For constituencies, the Commission must hold a local inquiry during a consultation on constituency boundaries if “*relevant representations objecting to a proposed recommendation*” are received either from (1) a council for an area which is wholly or partly comprised in the constituency, or (2) a body of not less than 100 electors for the affected constituency.
4. For regions, the test set out in the Act is for a local inquiry to be held if a council objects or a body of not less than 500 electors.

Council Responses

5. Renfrewshire Council has objected to both the Further Proposals for constituencies and the Provisional Proposals for regions and has requested a local inquiry – see Appendix B. The trigger for holding a local inquiry has therefore been met.
6. The issues raised by Renfrewshire Council were:
 - Expressed concerns about constituency design approach. Considers this approach fetters the Commission’s discretion, results in illogical outcomes and is open to challenge.
 - Renfrewshire West: no objection to changes relating to Neilston and Bishopston. Does object to the inclusion of Ward 8 in Paisley as it splits the ward
 - Erskine, Renfrew and Cardonald: asks for Cardonald to be removed as no part of Glasgow constituency should be included. If any of Glasgow constituency should be included, area within UK parliamentary constituency of Paisley and Renfrewshire North. Entirety of ward 4 should remain Paisley constituency.
 - Region: No part of Renfrewshire should be included in the Glasgow region as there are no physical or transport links between Bishopston and Erskine and Glasgow. This would result in some wards being represented by 14 different MSPs and would impact the election administration. Suggested alternative is for either Eastwood or one of the two constituencies containing Clydebank, Milngavie, Bearsden, Bishopbriggs and Kirkintilloch to be included in the Glasgow region.
7. A local inquiry was held in Johnstone/Newton Mearns relating to Glasgow Priesthill and Giffnock; Paisley and Renfrew; Renfrewshire South; Renfrewshire West (at the Provisional Proposal stage). After the consultation on the Revised Proposals, the

Commission considered the response from Neilston Community Council and agreed that a further local inquiry should not be held in the area as there was an obvious solution (amending the boundary by Neilston and Bishopton). Renfrewshire Council did not object at the Revised Proposal stage. No previous local inquiry has been held in relation to the Erskine, Renfrew and Cardonald constituency.

8. Any decision made at this stage does not preclude the Commission from agreeing to hold further local inquiries after considering all of the consultation responses.

Decision

9. The Secretariat invites the Commission to provide formal approval for a local inquiry to be held in Renfrewshire. This will allow the Secretariat to arrange for a Sheriff Principal to be appointed as Assistant Commissioner and set a date for the local inquiry. It is proposed that one local inquiry (with two sessions) will be held to allow the public to raise concerns with the Further Proposals for constituencies (Erskine, Renfrew and Cardonald and potentially Renfrewshire West) and the Provisional Proposals for regions (Glasgow/West Scotland).
10. The Secretariat will fully analyse all responses received during the public consultation and present analysis to the Commission at a later meeting. It is open to the Commission to agree to hold further local inquiries once it has conducted further analysis of all responses.

Extract from the Scotland Act 1998 (as amended)

Local inquiries

- 6 (1) Boundaries Scotland may if it thinks fit cause a local inquiry to be held in respect of any constituency or constituencies.
- (2) If Boundaries Scotland receive any relevant representations objecting to a proposed recommendation for the alteration of a constituency it must not make the recommendation unless since the publication of the notice under paragraph 7(2) a local inquiry has been held in respect of the constituency.
- (3) If a local inquiry was held in respect of the constituency before the publication of the notice under paragraph 7(2), sub-paragraph (2) above does not apply if Boundaries Scotland after considering—
- (a) the matters discussed at the inquiry,
 - (b) the nature of the relevant representations received, and
 - (c) any other relevant circumstances,
- think that a further local inquiry is not justified.
- (4) A relevant representation is a representation made in accordance with paragraph 7(2)(b)—
- (a) by the council for an area which is wholly or partly comprised in the constituency;
 - (b) by a body of not less than 100 persons entitled to vote as electors at an election for membership of the Parliament held in the constituency.

- 7 (1) Boundaries Scotland may if it thinks fit cause a local inquiry to be held in respect of any region or regions.
- (2) If Boundaries Scotland receive any relevant representations objecting to a proposed recommendation for the alteration of a region it must not make the recommendation unless since the publication of the notice under paragraph 7(2) a local inquiry has been held in respect of the region.
- (3) If a local inquiry was held in respect of the region before the publication of the notice under paragraph 7(2), sub-paragraph (2) above does not apply if Boundaries Scotland after considering—
- (a) the matters discussed at the inquiry,
 - (b) the nature of the relevant representations received, and
 - (c) any other relevant circumstances,
- think that a further local inquiry is not justified.
- (4) A relevant representation is a representation made in accordance with paragraph 7(2)(b)—
- (a) by the council for an area which is wholly or partly included in the region;
 - (b) by a body of not less than 500 persons entitled to vote as electors at an election for membership of the Parliament held in any one or more of the constituencies included in the region.
