

# The Dumbarton and Clydebank Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by paragraph 1(1) of Schedule 2 to the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994(a) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and after carrying out such consultation as he considers appropriate, hereby makes the following Direction:

## Citation and commencement

1. This Direction may be cited as the Dumbarton and Clydebank Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994 and shall come into force on 11th November 1994.

## Interpretation

2. In this Direction—

“Clydebank Report” means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Clydebank District dated 24th August 1994(b);

“Dumbarton Report” means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Dumbarton District dated 13th September 1994.

## Specification of Wards

3. For the purpose of any election of councillors held before the relevant year of election, the Dumbarton and Clydebank local government area shall be divided into 22 electoral wards being—

- (a) the eleven proposed wards described in the Clydebank Report;
- (b) the seven proposed wards numbered district ward 1 (Dumbarton West) to district ward 5 (Dumbarton East/Bowling), district ward 12 (Renton/Alexandria South) and district ward 13 (Alexandria North/Tullichewan) described in the Dumbarton report with those electoral wards being numbered wards 12 to 18 respectively in place of the numbering of those proposed wards in the Dumbarton Report;
- (c) the following electoral ward:—

### **Electoral Ward 19: Balloch**

Those parts of proposed ward numbered district ward 14 (Balloch and Luss) described in the Dumbarton Report so far as lying within the Dumbarton and Clydebank local government area.; and

- (d) the three proposed wards numbered district ward 15 (Haldane/Kilmaronock/Jamestown) to district ward 17 (Riverside) described in the Dumbarton Report with those electoral wards being numbered wards 20, 21 and 22 respectively in place of the numbering of those proposed wards in the Dumbarton Report.
