

# The East Ayrshire Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by paragraph 1(1) of Schedule 2 to the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994(a) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and after carrying out such consultation as he considers appropriate, hereby makes the following Direction:

## Citation and commencement

1. This Direction may be cited as the East Ayrshire Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994 and shall come into force on 11th November 1994.

## Interpretation

2. In this Direction—

“Cumnock and Doon Valley Report” means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Cumnock and Doon Valley District dated 5th May 1994(b);

“Kilmarnock and Loudoun Report” means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Kilmarnock and Loudoun District dated 12th August 1994.

## Specification of Wards

3. For the purposes of any election of councillors held before the relevant year of election, the East Ayrshire local government area shall be divided into 30 electoral wards being—

- (a) the twenty proposed wards described in the Kilmarnock and Loudoun Report;  
and
- (b) the ten proposed wards described in the Cumnock and Doon Valley Report with those electoral wards being numbered wards 21 to 30 respectively in place of the numbering of the proposed wards in the Cumnock and Doon Valley Report.
