

The Moray Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements)
Direction 1994

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by paragraph 1(1) of Schedule 2 to the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994(a) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and after carrying out such consultation as he considers appropriate, hereby makes the following Direction:

Citation and commencement

1. This Direction may be cited as the Moray Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994 and shall come into force on 11th November 1994.

Specification of Wards

2.— (1) For the purpose of any election of councillors held before the relevant year of election, the Moray local government area shall be divided into 18 electoral wards being the proposed wards described (subject to the amendment set out in sub-paragraph (2) below) in the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Moray District dated 29th October 1993(b).

(2) For the purposes of this Direction, in the description of the ward referred to in the said report as District Ward 9 (Lossiemouth) for the words "western perimeter of the burial grounds; then northeastward to and along the said perimeter", substitute the words "southern corner of the burial ground; then northeastward along the eastern perimeter of the said burial ground".
