

The North Lanarkshire Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements)  
Direction 1994

The Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by paragraph 1(1) of Schedule 2 to the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994(a) and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, and after carrying out such consultation as he considers appropriate, hereby makes the following Direction:

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Direction may be cited as the North Lanarkshire Local Government Area (Electoral Arrangements) Direction 1994 and shall come into force on 11th November 1994.

**Interpretation**

- 2.— (1) In this Direction—

“electoral division” means a division of Strathclyde Region as constituted by the Strathclyde Region (Electoral Arrangements) Order 1993(b);

“Cumbernauld and Kilsyth Report” means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Cumbernauld and Kilsyth District dated 17th August 1994(c);

"Monklands Report" means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Monklands District dated 29th August 1994;

"Motherwell Report" means the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Motherwell District dated 7th September 1994.

(2) In the descriptions of the boundaries of Electoral Wards 66 to 69 set out in this Direction—

- (a) a reference to an Electoral Ward shall be construed as a reference to that Electoral Ward as constituted by this Direction;
- (b) a reference to a road, footpath, track, railway line, river, burn, stream or canal shall, where the context so admits, be construed as the centre line of the feature concerned; and
- (c) the following abbreviation is used—

"NG Ref" for National Grid Reference as published on Ordnance Survey Maps.

### Specification of Wards

3. For the purpose of any election of councillors held before the relevant year of election, the North Lanarkshire local government area shall be divided into 69 electoral wards being—

- (a) the thirty proposed wards described in the Motherwell Report;

- (b) the twenty proposed wards described in the Monklands Report with those electoral wards being numbered wards 31 to 50 respectively in place of the numbering of the proposed wards in the Monklands Report;
- (c) the fifteen proposed wards described in the Cumbernauld and Kilsyth Report with those electoral wards being numbered wards 51 to 65 respectively in place of the numbering of the proposed wards in the Cumbernauld and Kilsyth Report; and
- (d) the four electoral wards having the names, numbers and boundaries set out in the Schedule to this Direction.

**Electoral Ward 66: Stepps**

Commencing on the western boundary of electoral division 46 (Chryston) at NG Ref NS 6487 6897 on the M80 (Stepps Bypass); then generally northeastward and southeastward along the said Bypass road to its junction with the A80(T) road at the Hornshill Roundabout; then generally southeastward by field boundaries to the Glasgow to Cumbernauld railway line; then westward along the said railway to the northeastern corner of the Cardowan Fire Station; then southeastward and southwestward along the eastern and southern boundaries of the said Fire Station to a point in line with the eastern boundary of No 65 Cardowan Road; then southeastward to and along the said boundary of No 65 Cardowan Road and continuing in a straight line to the northern boundary of St Joseph's RC Church; then northeastward along the said boundary to and northeastward and southeastward along the northern and eastern boundaries of St Joseph's RC Primary School; then northeastward and southeastward along the rear curtilages of the properties in Drimnin Road to Dorlin Road; then northeastward along Dorlin Road to the southern boundary of said electoral division 46; then generally southward, westward and northward along the southern and western boundaries of the said electoral division to the point of commencement.

**Electoral Ward 67: Chryston and Auchinloch**

Commencing at NG Ref NS 6487 6897 on the western boundary of electoral division 46 (Chryston) where it meets the northern boundary of Electoral Ward 66 (Stepps); then generally northwestward and northeastward along the western and northern boundaries of the said electoral division to the point where the Glasgow to Edinburgh railway line is crossed by Crosshill Road; then southeastward along the said road to and westward along Robroyston Road to the western curtilage of Loch Farm; then generally southward, eastward and northward along the western, southern and eastern curtilages of Loch Farm to Crosshill Road; then eastward and southeastward along the said road to the unnamed access road to

Gadloch Farm; then generally southeastward along the said access road and its continuation as a track to the point where it reaches the Gadloch at NG Ref NS 6537 7100; then eastward in a straight line to Auchinloch Road; then southeastward along the said road to NG Ref NS 6602 7097; then eastward to and along the southern boundary of Lenzie Hospital and continuing eastward and northeastward along field boundaries to the Cult Burn at NG Ref NS 6674 7112; then southeastward and southwestward along the said burn to a field boundary at NG Ref NS 6688 7089; then southeastward along the said field boundary to Burnbrae Road; then generally northeastward and northwestward along the said road to and eastward and southeastward along a disused railway line, now a public footpath to NG Ref NS 6825 7142; then northward along another disused railway line until it crosses Muckcroft Road at NG Ref NS 6820 7176; then eastward, southward and eastward along Muckcroft Road to and southeastward along Auchengeich Road to and southwestward along Gartferry Road to where it is crossed by a disused railway line, now a public footpath; then generally southeastward along the said footpath until it is crossed by the A80(T) road; then southwestward along the said road to NG Ref NS 6901 6973; then southward to and southeastward along the western boundary of an unnamed wooded strip to and southwestward along the northern curtilage of Glaudhall Farm and its continuation as a field boundary to the northeastern corner of St Barbara's RC Church; then southward along the eastern boundary of the said church to Drumcavel Road; then westward along the said road to and southwestward along Station Road and its prolongation to and westward along the Glasgow to Cumbernauld railway line to the eastern boundary of said Electoral Ward 66; then generally northward and southwestward along the eastern and northern boundaries of said Electoral Ward 66 to the point of commencement.

#### **Electoral Ward 68: North Moodiesburn**

Commencing on the northern boundary of Electoral Ward 67 (Chryston and Auchinloch) at NG Ref NS 6820 7176 where a disused railway line crosses Muckcroft Road; then northward along the said disused railway to where it crosses an unnamed stream at NG Ref NS 6815 7204; then eastward along the unnamed stream and its continuation as a drain to the Luggie Water; then southeastward along the Luggie Water to the eastern boundary of Strathkelvin District; then generally southward along the said District boundary to Drumcavel

Road; then southwestward along the said road to Avenuehead Road; then northwestward along the said road, crossing the A80(T) road, to and continuing northward along Stoneyetts Road to Glenmanor Avenue; then westward and northward along the said avenue to and southwestward along Gartferry road to the eastern boundary of said Electoral Ward 67; then generally northwestward and westward along the eastern and northern boundaries of said Electoral Ward 67 to the point of commencement.

**Electoral Ward 69: South Moodiesburn and Gartcosh**

Commencing on the eastern boundary of Strathkelvin District where it meets the southern boundary of Electoral Ward 68 (North Moodiesburn); then generally southward and westward along the eastern and southern boundaries of Strathkelvin District to the eastern boundary of Electoral Ward 66 (Stepps); then generally northwestward and eastward along the boundary of said Electoral Ward 66 to the southern boundary of Electoral Ward 67 (Chryston and Auchinloch); then generally eastward, northeastward, northwestward and northeastward along the southern and eastern boundaries of said Electoral Ward 67 to the western boundary of said Electoral Ward 68; then generally northeastward, southeastward and northeastward along the western and southern boundaries of said Electoral Ward 68 to the point of commencement.
