

Third Statutory Review of Electoral Arrangements Perth and Kinross Council Area

Introduction

1. The Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 determined that on and after 1 April 1996, Scotland should be divided into local government areas as named and described in Schedule 1 to the Act and that, for each area, there should be a council consisting of a convener and councillors. It further determined that each council should have all the functions exercised immediately before 1 April in relation to their area by any existing regional, islands or district council.
2. On 1 April 1996 all local government areas existing immediately before that date which were regions and districts and all regional and district councils ceased to exist.
3. Schedule 2 of the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 also established that every local government area (other than areas of the old islands councils) should be divided into such electoral wards as may be specified in a direction made by the Secretary of State after carrying out such consultations as he considered appropriate. Those wards were to apply for the purpose of any election of councillors held before 'the relevant year of election' (defined as meaning the first year of ordinary election of councillors for the area in question occurring after the making of an order constituting the new electoral wards of that local government area in consequence of the review currently being undertaken by the Commission). In accordance with procedures that applied prior to the reorganisation in 1975, the views of councils were invited. Thereafter, the Secretary of State determined that, for the purpose of any election of councillors before the relevant year of election, 32 electoral wards were appropriate for Perth and Kinross local government area. Additionally, the proposed wards should be as described in the report of the Local Government Boundary Commission for Scotland to the Secretary of State for Scotland on its second statutory review of electoral arrangements for Perth and Kinross District dated 16 March 1994 (Wards 1-31) and the area comprising Polling District PDB and those parts of Polling District PDA which fall within the Perth and Kinross Local Government area (Ward 32).

Origin and Commencement of the Review

4. The Commission has a statutory duty under section 14 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973 to undertake periodic reviews of local authority electoral arrangements. The Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994 amended section 20 and schedule 5 of the 1973 Act, directing that:

as soon as practicable after 1 April 1996, the Boundary Commission shall-

review the electoral arrangements for all local government areas for the purpose of considering the future electoral arrangements for those areas; and

formulate proposals for those arrangements.

5. This, therefore, is one of the statutory reviews required in terms of section 16(2) and Schedule 5 of the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, as amended.
6. On 22 March 1996, the Scottish Office Development Department gave local authorities advance notice of the intention of the Commission to carry out a third statutory review of electoral arrangements. On 29 March 1996, we wrote to all councils to announce the commencement of the third statutory review of electoral arrangements and to explain the procedures to be followed. We also gave notice of the commencement of the review to all Community Councils, Electoral Registration Officers, Members of Parliament with a constituency interest and the Scottish headquarters of the political parties. In addition, public notice of the commencement of the review, which included an invitation to interested parties to apply to us for a copy of our consultation letter to councils, was given in newspapers.

Background

7. During the passage through Parliament of the 1994 Act, there was cross-Party understanding that we would review the number of councillors and boundaries of electoral wards for each council in time for changes to be implemented for the 1999 local elections. This was seen to be important because at the time of reorganisation, as mentioned above, the Secretary of State defined the electoral wards for the new councils and to a great extent based these on existing district wards. It was, however, recognised that using the existing district wards led to some councils being significantly over-represented in relation to other areas. Further, it also led to councillors within the same local authority areas representing wards with significantly different numbers of electors. Accordingly, our review was seen as important to ensure equity in representation across and within all local authorities. Further, the new authorities were now responsible for the provision of the full range of all services and, accordingly, consideration had to be given to determining an appropriate number of councillors for service provision to be effectively managed.
8. This review is, therefore, the first conducted by us which sets out to determine the appropriate number of councillors required for councils to operate efficiently and to establish the boundaries of electoral wards. To achieve both objectives our review was conducted in 2 main stages:

identification of a suitable methodology for determining numbers of councillors which, applied across all local authority areas, would be seen to be equitable and consistent; and

the division of each local authority area into the appropriate number of electoral wards in accordance with the statutory rules.

9. A copy of the statutory rules to be employed by us and the Secretary of State in considering proposals for electoral arrangements is provided at Appendix A

Number of Councillors

10. In formulating proposals for the number of councillors we have been guided by two main principles:

effective management of councils; and

equity amongst electors.

11. We recognised that the number of councillors is crucial because there is, undoubtedly, some number below which it would be impossible for a council to discharge its duty to deliver services to its population and, conversely, there is also some number above which a council becomes unwieldy and cumbersome. We were influenced in this respect by the prior considerations of two other bodies.
12. The Royal Commission on Local Government In Scotland 1966-69, under the Chairmanship of the Rt. Hon. Lord Wheatley, provided a basis by which the number of regional councillors and the size of constituency to be represented might be determined by taking into account the fact that population density varies widely in Scotland as a whole and within regions. The then accepted view was that council size should not generally exceed 75 members. In England and Wales the Redcliffe-Maude Commission, which reported to Parliament in 1969, also drew attention to the management problems of large councils and endorsed the recommendation of The Committee on the Management of Local Government that a maximum number of 75 councillors should be set.
13. After careful consideration we concluded that, in the Scottish context and to provide additional flexibility, an upper limit of 80 councillors should be set. We also concluded that a minimum number of councillors should be set, recognising that even the smallest local government areas are now responsible for a wide range of functions. Accordingly, we decided that the minimum number of councillors should be 18. Further, these limits should apply to all councils.
14. Regarding equity as between voters, we considered that ideally each elector's vote should possess the same weight and significance in local government elections throughout the country; furthermore, ideally, there should be similar mutual

accessibility between electors and councillors. However, since Scotland is a country of great diversity, both geographically, and demographically, a fact reflected in the areas for which councils created by the Act of 1994 are responsible, and since we are satisfied that, in the interests of good local government, the number of councillors in any council must fall within certain limits, we concluded that these ideals are unattainable in practice. In this situation, recognising that a fair degree of homogeneity exists within certain groups of councils, which exhibit broadly similar geographic and demographic characteristics, we resolved to strive for equity in the senses mentioned within these groups, so far as that is possible within the constraints of the legislation under which we operate.

15. We, therefore, proposed a methodology which initially categorised council areas by density and distribution of population using data available from the 1991 Census of Population. Having classified council areas according to these criteria and adjusted the ratio of electors to each councillor to take account of similar characteristics, we have been able to achieve a broad equity of electorate across and within all council areas.
16. In our letter of 29 March 1996, all councils were informed of the proposed methodology and future pattern of representation for their council area. Councils were requested to make any representations they wished on numbers of councillors by 29 April 1996 so that a meeting could be arranged with the Deputy Chairman and Secretary to discuss the pattern of representation and any matters regarding our review that the Council wished to raise. Following visits to all councils by the Deputy Chairman and Secretary to discuss the proposed methodology and to consider alternatives which could be applied across Scotland, no alternative methodologies were offered but a number of councils suggested that the underlying classification should be amended to include an additional category.
17. At our meeting of 17 June 1996, we re-examined the criteria to be used to categorise mainland councils with similar characteristics in light of the representations made by a number of councils. We concluded that there should be 6 rather than 5 categories. The final categorisation of similar mainland councils was then agreed as follows:
 - Category 1 Large Cities Glasgow and Edinburgh.
 - Category 2 Cities Aberdeen and Dundee.
 - Category 3 Authorities with less than 60% of the population living outwith settlements of 10,000 or more persons **AND** an overall population density of one person or more per hectare.
 - Category 4 Authorities with **EITHER** 60% or more of the population living outwith settlements of 10,000 or more persons **OR** an overall population density of less than one person per hectare.

- Category 5 Authorities with 60% or more of the population living outwith settlements of 10,000 or more persons **AND** an overall population density of less than one person per hectare.
- Category 6 Authorities with 60% or more of the population living outwith settlements of 10,000 or more persons **AND** an overall population density of less than 0.2 persons per hectare.

18. In addition to the 6 categories we then determined the ratio of councillors to electorate for mainland councils that would allow for efficient management and appropriate representation, as set out in paragraphs 11 - 14 above, and considered that the following would be appropriate:

19. On 20 June 1996 we wrote to all mainland councils informing them of the revised criteria for determining councillor numbers and inviting them to prepare a draft scheme of electoral arrangements for their Council area. Following upon that, Aberdeen City Council brought a petition for Judicial Review of the decision taken by us at our meeting of 17 June, 1996 in the Court of Session. In it they sought a decree of declarator that that decision in relation to them was unlawful, ultra vires and null and void; they also sought a decree of reduction of the decision in relation to them and certain ancillary remedies. We resisted this petition, which was dismissed by the Court on 20 December 1996 after a hearing.

20. We considered the ratio of councillors to electors for the 3 islands councils at our meeting of 26 August 1996 and concluded that the appropriate ratio would be 1:750. On 28 August 1996 we wrote to these councils informing them of our decision.

21. On 18 July 1996, Perth and Kinross Council acknowledged our decision that 41 electoral wards would provide the appropriate level of representation for its area and confirmed that, although the timetable was considered to be very tight, every effort would be made to submit a draft scheme of electoral arrangements by the end of September 1996.

Perth and Kinross Council's Proposals

22. The Council submitted a scheme of electoral arrangements for 41 wards on 14 January 1997, wrote to all Community Councils seeking their views and

published details of its draft proposal in local newspapers asking that representation be made directly to the Commission by 28 February 1997.

23. As a result of the public consultation exercise only 2 representations were received. The Council was invited to comment on the proposals set out in these representations and, where appropriate, to provide revised electorate data so that the impact of making revisions to its draft proposals could be assessed.
24. A single representation objected to the Council's proposals regarding the division of Crieff between Wards 12 and 13. The Council commented that it had originally considered the sub-division of Crieff on the east/west basis suggested. However, it had not been possible to determine a logical boundary running east/west through the town which would divide the community into two balanced wards and met the statutory criteria regarding electoral parity. The decision, therefore, was to accept a north/south division which produced two balanced wards. Further, electorate data provided by the Council indicated that to adjust the boundary as suggested by the representation would require the transfer of 951 electors from Ward 12 to Ward 13. The effect would be to alter the divergence from electoral parity achieved by the Council for these wards (-1% and 2% respectively) to -30% and 31% which would be unacceptable in terms of the statutory rules. Accordingly, we agreed to accept the Council's proposals for Wards 12 and 13.
25. The other representation objected to the proposed boundaries of Wards 18 - 20 because the lines did not follow established Community Council boundaries. It was considered that this would adversely affect Community Councils by requiring that, in future, they work with 2 councillors. In our deliberations regarding electoral arrangements we consider that it is not practicable to maintain boundaries that are determined elsewhere for purposes unrelated to local electoral arrangements. The Council's proposals for Wards 18 - 20 complied with the need to maintain good electoral parity and there were no other special geographical considerations which would make departure from the rule desirable. Accordingly, we rejected this request.
26. Our initial examination of the Council's draft proposals suggested that boundaries could in some instances be better defined or that a better balance of electorate between adjoining wards could be achieved by minor boundary alterations and we asked the Council to provide numbers of electors for areas where it was thought that change would be practicable. These are discussed below. When providing the data we requested, the Council also took the opportunity to offer comments in a number of cases.
27. The Council offered no comments on our proposal for amending the boundary between Wards 5 and 18. On the basis of the electorate data provided we concluded that a change which would produce a stronger boundary line and a modest improvement in electoral parity in both wards should be adopted.
28. We were concerned to make adjustments to the boundaries of Wards 15, 22 and 35 which would have the effect of reducing the sizeable divergence from parity in

Ward 15. The Council, however, was of the view that this would mean dividing a small community and result in a boundary that was clearly contrived to bring closer convergence with electoral parity. After considering the matter in some detail we concluded that the Council's proposals for this area should be retained.

29. We considered that it might be possible to improve the boundary definition between Wards 23 and 24 in a manner which would also marginally improve the balance of electorate in terms of parity. The Council opposed our proposed amendment and, after considering the matter further, we agreed that the boundary as defined in the Council's proposals should remain.
30. The boundaries between Wards 35, 37 and 38 were closely examined with a view to achieving a better balance of electors and well defined lines. The Council offered no comment on our proposals and the electorate data provided offered marginal improvements on the parity obtained in the Council's scheme. We, therefore, agreed to adopt the proposed revisions.
31. The Council informed us of requests for amendments to be made to the boundaries between Wards 16 and 21, Wards 35 and 37 and Wards 13 and 35. After considering the electorate data and supporting maps, and bearing in mind our considerations at paragraphs 28 and 30 above, we agreed to accept the proposed amendment to the boundary between Wards 13 and 35. We agreed to retain the boundary between wards 16 and 21 as set out in our provisional proposals. We also considered that our revisions to the boundaries of Wards 35, 37 and 38 provided stronger boundaries and a better balance of electorate than what was now proposed for Wards 35 and 37 and, therefore, agreed that the revised boundaries should stand as our provisional proposals.
32. We had considerable concerns regarding the significant divergence from parity in Ward 1 (44%) and accordingly requested that officers of the Commission examine the practicality of revising the boundaries of this and adjoining wards. Our officers met with Council Officials to discuss the practicalities of achieving a ward structure which would reduce the divergence from electoral parity shown in Ward 1 to an acceptable level. The Council view was that it was unlikely that the problem in this area could be resolved without substantial knock-on effects throughout the remainder of the Council area. After a thorough examination of the options for change and having spent time in the area, our officers reported that the geography, topography and communications links made it impractical to achieve any significant reduction in the divergence from parity without having serious implications for adjoining wards. It was considered that the best option available, resulting in a ward with a divergence from parity of -26%, would link small settlements which, at the extremes, were approximately 90 kilometres apart. Accordingly, we accepted that, because of the geography, topography and communications links in the area, it would not be practicable to revise the boundaries of Ward 1 to achieve more acceptable electoral parity.

Publication of Commission's Provisional Proposals

33. Public notice was given of the publication of our provisional proposals on 17 July 1997. Perth and Kinross Council was asked to make copies of the electoral ward boundary descriptions, electoral statistics and illustrative maps available for inspection at their offices. Additionally, copies of our proposals were sent to all who had received our consultation letter or had expressed an interest. We asked that any comments should be made to us by 14 August 1997.

Consideration of Representations

34. Four letters were received:

- **Pitlochry and Moulin Community Council** advised that they had no comment on the proposals for its area.
- ♦ **Mid Atholl, Strathtay and Grandtully Community Council** advised that it objected to the increase in the number of wards in Perth and Kinross Council area.
- ♦ A single letter was received which advised that while the correspondent was delighted to find his property lay within one of the two Crieff wards it was thought that a neighbouring house approximately one mile from Crieff should be included in Ward 13 and not Ward 35. No objections were received from the occupants of the property involved. We considered that the boundary line was appropriately drawn and, accordingly, agreed to retain the boundary as set out in our provisional proposals.
- ♦ A single representation objected to the boundary between Wards 16 and 21 and requested that the north side of Highfield Road should be included in Ward 16 in the interests of community ties. A similar representation had been made following publication of the Council's draft scheme. We noted that although the impact on electoral parity was small it widened the balance struck in the Council's draft scheme. Further, no representations asking that the boundary be altered to include the properties in question in Ward 16 had been received from residents. Accordingly, we agreed to retain the boundary as set out in our provisional proposals.

Final Recommendation

35. Having conducted the third statutory review of electoral arrangements for Perth and Kinross Council area in accordance with the procedures described above, we **recommend** that future electoral arrangements for the said Council should provide for a Council of 41 members.

36. The designation of the electoral wards that we recommend for Perth and Kinross Council, together with information which we have received from the Council as to the 1996 electorate and forecast 2001 electorate of the proposed wards are set out at Appendix B to this report.
37. The boundaries of the proposed electoral wards are described in Appendix C and the following illustrative maps accompany this report:

**Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973: Schedule 6
(As amended by the Local Government etc. (Scotland) Act 1994)
Rules to be Observed in Considering Electoral Arrangements**

1. (1) This Schedule applies to the consideration by the Secretary of State or the Boundary Commission of the electoral arrangements for election of councillors of local government areas.
 - (2) Having regard to any change in the number or distribution of electors of a local government area likely to take place within the period of five years immediately following the consideration, the number of local government electors shall be, as nearly as may be, the same in every electoral area of that local government area.
 - (3) Subject to sub-paragraph (2) above, in considering the electoral arrangements referred to in sub-paragraph (1) above regard shall be had to-
 - (a) the desirability of fixing boundaries which are and will remain easily identifiable;
 - (b) any local ties which would be broken by the fixing of any particular boundary.
2. The strict application of the rule stated in paragraph 1(2) above may be departed from in any area where special geographical conditions appear to render a departure desirable.
