## Local government in Scotland: before 1975

Boundaries Scotland was established by the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973, with responsibility for keeping under review local government areas and electoral arrangements in Scotland.

### Structure in 1973

At the time of our establishment in 1973, there were 37 counties covering Scotland, including *counties of city* comprising each of the four major cities (Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh and Glasgow). The counties were all-purpose authorities responsible for a wide range of services. Outside the counties of city, the counties contained 21 *large burghs*, which had a wide range of functions and were generally independent of the counties, and 176 *small burghs* which had limited powers including housing, but were generally serviced by the counties, although independent of them. The remaining area of the counties was divided into 196 districts with very limited powers (also known as *landward districts*). These administrative units had been largely unchanged since 1889, with the distinction between large and small burghs dating from the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1929 when the criterion used was that a large burgh had a population of more than 20,000.

By the 1960s there was general agreement that the system of local government in Scotland was in need of reform. The Royal Commission on Local Government in Scotland, chaired by Lord Wheatley, was appointed in 1966 and reported in 1969. In its report, the Wheatley Commission recommended a two-tier structure of local government in Scotland. As a result, a system of 9 Regions, 53 Districts and 3 Islands Areas was introduced by the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1973. The councils for the new local government areas took up their responsibilities on 16 May 1975, and the counties, burghs and landward districts ceased to exist from that date. The local government areas introduced by the 1973 Act and their subsequent development are described in our Information Paper *Local government area boundaries in Scotland: 1974 to 1996*.

The names of the counties prior to their abolition were as follows. County names were often used with the suffix *shire* added to the name listed: this has been omitted for clarity in this document.

<sup>1</sup> In the Local Government (Scotland) Acts 1929 and 1947, the counties of Perth and Kinross, and the counties of Moray and Nairn, were combined for most but not all purposes. Each of the counties also continued to exist as separate entities until their abolition in 1975.

The burghs that existed within each county immediately prior to their abolition are listed in Appendix A, together with the Islands Area or Region and District in which they were situated, and the current council areas in which they are situated.

Each county is listed in Appendix B with the Islands Areas, Regions and Districts which succeeded it.

The landward districts in each county are listed in Appendix C along with the electoral divisions in each one.

### **Powers and responsibilities**

The division of powers and responsibilities between the counties, burghs and districts was complex, and was generally specified in the Local Government (Scotland) Acts of 1929 and 1947. Roads and education functions were carried out by counties. Many, but not all, large burghs were responsible for policing, and in the rest of Scotland counties fulfilled this function. Public health, social services, registration of births, marriages and deaths, and electoral registration were carried out by large burghs, and by counties for the majority of Scotland where large burghs did not exist. Large and small burghs were responsible for collecting local property-based taxes (known as "the rates") and the associated valuation of property, while in the rest of Scotland counties fulfilled this function. Building control, housing, lighting and drainage functions were carried out by large burghs, small burghs and districts. These areas of responsibility are summarised in the table below.

### **Earlier structure**

The county structure and boundaries had remained very stable in Scotland since the late 19th century. The Local Government (Scotland) Act 1889 made substantial changes to the organisation of counties and burghs, and was also very significant in defining the boundaries of counties: the previously separate counties of Ross and Cromarty were to form a single county, the previous single county of Orkney and Zetland was divided into 2 counties, the boundaries between the counties of Aberdeen, Banff and Moray (then known as Elgin) were amended.

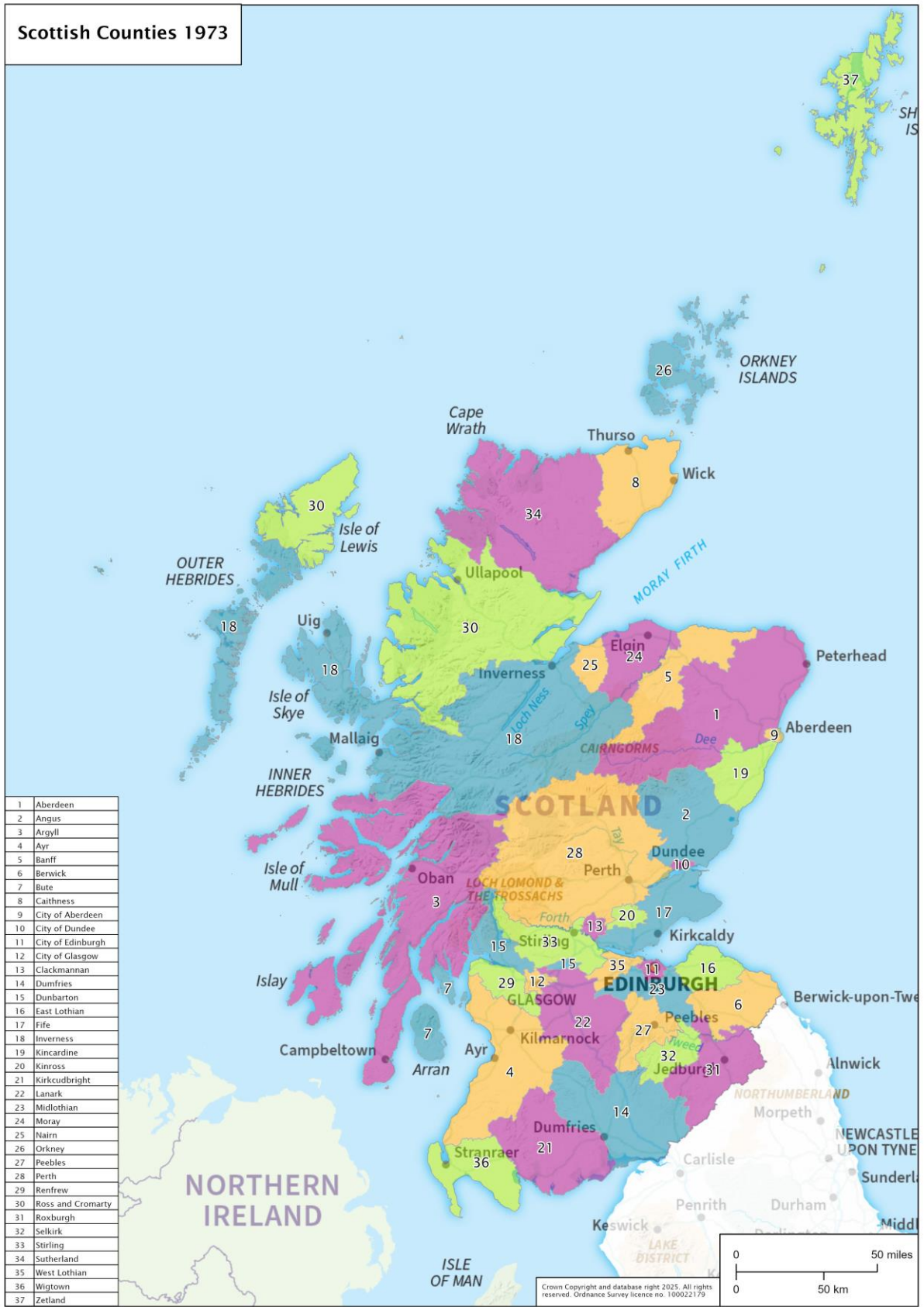

Part 7 of the 1889 Act established Boundary Commissioners to look at county, burgh, parish and electoral division boundaries, and gave them power to implement changes they judged necessary. The Commissioners worked from 1890 to 1892, and produced a report in December 1892 which documented the various changes they had implemented during their work. Their work included considering the significant number of cases where counties had detached parts, and where burghs were partly in each of 2 counties – these cases were largely removed by the changes arising from the Commissioners' work.

Since that time, the changes to county boundaries were incremental until their abolition in 1975. Most of these incremental changes arose from the growth of the cities of Aberdeen, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow, and the growth of burghs which were adjacent to county boundaries (such as Dumfries and Galashiels) where it was intended that the burgh was wholly contained within a county.

**Population and representation**

The distribution of Scotland's population across the different local authority areas was very varied. As documented in the Wheatley Commission report, official population estimates for 1968 show the counties of cities ranging from Aberdeen and Dundee with around 180,000 each, Edinburgh with around 470,000 and Glasgow with 945,000 residents. The other 33 counties varied in population from Kinross with 6,300 and Moray with 8,100 to the county of Lanark with 606,800 residents. Large burghs ranged from Arbroath with 21,200 residents to Paisley with 95,100 residents. Small burghs included 17 burghs each with fewer than 1,000 residents and Kirkintilloch and Cumbernauld, each with more than 24,000 residents. The estimated 1968 total population for each category of local authority was:

Registered electors resident in each of these local authorities elected councillors to carry out the powers and responsibilities listed above. In addition, the large and small burghs within each county appointed members of their town councils to serve on the county council. We do not have data on the numbers of these appointed members of county councils. The number of elected representatives for local government in the early 1970s was:

The high number of elected representatives did not result in high levels of participation. The Wheatley Commission noted that in 1967, the last occasion before its report when elections took place in every kind of local authority, 63% of seats were uncontested. Further, where elections took place, only 47% of the electorate voted in the elections.

## Appendix A – Burghs

This Appendix lists the 21 large burghs and 176 small burghs which existed within Scotland's counties immediately prior to their abolition, together with the Islands Area or Region and District in which they were situated, and the current council areas in which they are situated. Many of the burghs existed from the 19th century or earlier: the date of creation of the few which were created after the Local Government (Scotland) Act 1929 is noted in the table below.

Burgh boundaries altered from time to time, but there was no continuing Boundary Commission for this purpose. The Local Government (Scotland) Act 1889 gave the Secretary of State power to amend county and burgh boundaries. It also appointed Boundary Commissioners with powers lasting from February 1890 to February 1892 to examine and make Orders for changes to the boundaries of counties, burghs and parishes.

The Local Government (Scotland) Act 1947 made new provisions about county and burgh boundary changes. It specified that county boundaries should be altered so that each burgh was wholly contained in a single county. It empowered Sheriffs to alter burgh boundaries and ward boundaries within a burgh after making appropriate inquiries, or to order the creation of a small burgh. Alterations normally took effect from the 16 May following the Sheriff's Order, but the Sheriff could specify that they should take effect retrospectively from the 16 May before the Sheriff's Order.
